Other plays produced in New York, Europe and across the U.S. include WHAT'S BUGGING GREG?, THE STICK WIFE, THE MUD ANGEL, DREAM HOUSE, BRAILLE GARDEN and THE SIRENS. Her musicals include HEARTLAND,

With this in mind, please understand that **Revelation Theatre does not condone, but rather rejects, any form of racism, sexism, or violent behavior.**

The Stick Wife contains:

- Verbal Abuse
- Alcohol consumption
- Hate Speech outdated and offensive terms such as "colored" are used
- Depiction of attempted Sexual Violence
- Hate Group Paraphernalia
- Firearm Use There are no gunshots Prop Rifles and Handguns are held and pointed

Director's Note

This play, *The Stick Wife*, represents two cycles for me. I produced and directed it 34 years ago at The Franklin Street Theater, which is now the Chop House on Franklin Street! I still feel the play is a seriously accomplished work. I'm thrilled by Darrah Cloud's rhythmic power games that echo from the ages of our culture.

What is a shameful reality is that the message of the play is still relevant. Remounting this material at this particular time felt appropriate, as we're experiencing a new age of old racist acting out, and women continuing to struggle to establish their full freedom. While greater awareness has taken hold in the last 34 years, and our behavior may be more in check, it's a slow-moving history.

We need to be reminded of our darker past. For many of us it's still raw, while the younger generations have to work with a racist and sexist history that has insinuated itself into our culture to systemic levels, and with the emotional residue that lingers from that. We need to be reminded of our darker past, because it's always in danger of repeating itself.

But also, *The Stick Wife* is a theatrical exploration, and one perspective on a vast history. This play rivets me with its desperate, needful characters, the tenacities of its women, and the raw truthfulness that lurks behind all the lies. I hope you have a similar reaction.

Revelation Theatre's first project, *Infinite Distances*, was developed and workshopped over eighteen months during the pandemic, it was presented last October for one weekend.

The Project is an exploration of the emotional and social conflicts of the covid-years through movement and spoken word. It was the company's debut devised production and relevant to all age groups, but it was also the first project for the company's Youth OUTREACH. This is significant, especially with current concerns regarding the mental health of many of our youth, due to the disruption by the pandemic on normal social development.

<u>Infinite Distances</u> addresses conflict and resolution with five performers, through a visceral physical presentation and interaction with the audience.

INFINITE DISTANCES was made possible by the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of the Office of the Governor and the New York State Legislature



We're in the process of bringing this devised performance back to young audiences next season.
